Colorado Blue Spruce <i>Picea pungens glauca</i>	10-16" S 18-24" T			WD	30-60'	<b>Avoid Inter-planting with Douglas Fir.</b> Used as x-mas tree and screen. Rigid, sharp blue green needles ¾" to 1 ½" long
* Eastern White Pine <i>Pinus strobes</i>	10-16" S 18-24" T			WD	50-80'	<b>Sensitive to salt.</b> Good screen. X-mas tree. Soft long needles range in color from green to blue-green
Norway Spruce <i>Picea abies</i>	10-16" S 18-24" T			A, M, WD	40-100'	Used for screen, x-mas tree and timber. Needs space. Short dark green needles.
* White Spruce <i>Picea glauca</i>	18-24" T		 	WT	40-60'	Used for x-mas tree, hedges, wind break. Pyramidal shape. Short dark green rigid needles.
<b>DECIDUOUS TREES</b>						
* Native Birch (Paper) <i>Betula papyrifera</i>	18-24"			A, M, WD	40-50'	White exfoliating bark. Dark green leaves turn butter yellow to golden in fall.
* River Birch <i>Betula nigra</i>	18-24"			WT	40-70'	The bark is exfoliating; gray-brown to ivory or copper colored. Flowers are inconspicuous.
* Sugar Maple <i>Acer saccharum</i>	18-24"			M, WD	60-75'	Brilliant fall leaf colors and pleasing growth habit.
* Thornless Honey Locust <i>Gleditsia triacanthos inermis</i>	10-12"			WT	30-70'	<b>Pollution, salt and drought tolerant.</b> Open silhouette lets grass grow underneath fragrant spring flowers
* White Flowering Dogwood <i>Cornus florida</i>	18-24"		 	A, M, WD	25'	White flowers in spring, bright red berries fall-winter. Good for wildlife.

* Arrowwood <i>Viburnum dentatum</i>	12-24"		 	WT	6-15'	White flowers May to June. Blue black fruit, September. Attracts birds.
* Blackberry <i>Rubus darrow</i>	12-24"			M,WD	4-6'	Large fruit is firm and sweet.. White flowers in May. Fruit in July. Self pollinating.
* Elderberry <i>Sambucus canadensis</i>	18-24"		 	WT	5-12'	White flowers mid June. Purple fruit mid Aug. Fruit is great for jams & wildlife.
 *Filbert American <i>Corylus americana</i>	18-24"	 	 	M,WD	8-15'	Nuts will mature in late September. pH adaptable, but prefers well-drained soils.
Forsythia <i>Forsythia sp</i>	18-24"			WT	8-10'	Golden yellow flowers in spring. Vigorous spreading shrub. Good hedge.
* Highbush Blueberry <i>Vaccinium</i>	9-12"	 		A,WD	5'	Mid season and late season fruit. Great for humans and wildlife. <b>Keep at 5 ft.</b>
Lilac <i>Syringa vulgaris</i>	12-24"			WT	8-15'	Purple or white flowers. Easy to grow. Flowers very fragrant. Good for hedge or screen.
* Raspberry <i>Rubus latham</i>	9-12"			WT	3-5'	White flower June-Aug. Fruit in June-July. Great for jams and Wildlife.

* Strawberry Bush <i>Euonymus americana</i>	12-24"	 		M	6-12'	Flowers reddish-greenish. Fruit is pink to scarlet. Thrives in thickets and swamps. Wildlife food
* Tag Alder <i>Alnus serrulata</i>	1 -2 '			M	6-20'	elongated yellow-catkins. excellent plants along stream banks and poor soil areas.
* Witch Hazel <i>Hamamelis virginiana</i>	18-24"			M	10-15'	Fragrant yellow spider like flowers bloom Oct-Nov. Good for border and wildlife

Daylily 10 Bulbs-flowers	Bulbs	 		WT	36 "	Perennial flower, orange with a yellow-gold throat. Highly adaptable plant. Drought resistant, almost disease free.
Hosta <i>Fortunei-Hyacinthina</i> Bundle of 10	Cutting			WD	22"	Spreading plant. blue-green leaf color & funnel-shaped. Lavender flower in July. excellent for erosion control.
Pachysandra Bundle of 50	Cutting			A,M WD	GC	Trailing evergreen. Spikes of snowy flowers bloom in April. Good cover under trees & shrubs.
Periwinkle / Myrtle Bundle of 50	Cutting			M,WT	GC	Evergreen vine. Grows almost anywhere, Green foliage is enhanced in May by a purple bloom.

Bird and Butterfly wildflower mix	If you want to bring the hummingbirds and songbirds in close to home, this is the mix for you.	
Deer Proof wildflower mix	Deer do not find these wildflowers palatable and leave it alone so you can enjoy a beautiful wildflower meadow. Grows 24-48" tall.	
Partial Shade wildflower mix	Good for hard to establish areas that are shaded. Will work very well with about 40% sunshine. All wildflowers do best in full sun, and this partial shade mix will flourish and prosper in filter sun. Grows 24-30".	
Perennial wildflower mix	17 species provide many colors. When fall planted, the flowers will blossom the following spring. When spring planted, if the conditions are right, there will be some flowering, but most will not flower until the following spring. Grows 36-40".
